# AFAQ's Health Program

Our objectives is fully in line with the Health cluster objectives and where specifically focus on:

Provide life-saving humanitarian assistance to the most vulnerable people with an emphasis on those in areas with high severity of needs.

As AFAQ's health program in 2022 includes the following:

- Providing essential primary health care (EHSP), including Community Health Workers (CHWs), Risk Communication Community Engagement (RCCE), and Community Based Surveillance (CBS) activities.
- Providing secondary and specialized health care, including maternity, pediatrics, internal medicines, blood transfusion, dialysis, and Physiotherapy.
- Capacity building: Provision of training in different health topics for health workers.

## **Primary Health Care Program:**

Consists of two divisions :

- facility based PHC program: through supporting 5 PHCs and 1 mobile clinic.
- Community based PHC program: through supporting 8 CHWs , community based surveillance program , Risk communication and community engagement "RCCE" for Cholera and Covid 19.

## **Secondary and specialized health care Program:**

- Salqin Hospital for Child and Maternity MNCH.
- Dialysis center in Qah.
- Al Hidaya General hospital in Qah

## Health, Nutrition, and WASH integration

Deliver Primary healthcare services according Essential Health Service Package (EHSP) in five PHC fixed facilities, one mobile clinic, one maternal and child hospital and six RRTs.

All AFAQ services shall be integrated with WASH services through:  
medical waste management

Safe water provision- Hand hygiene resources.

Support hygiene promotion

Rising WASH awareness by providing Key messages (Hand Washing, Food-Processing).

## Health and Nutrition **integration**

Deliver Primary healthcare services according Essential Health Service Package (EHSP) in five PHC fixed facilities, one mobile clinic, one maternal and child hospital.

AFAQ apply CMAM program (screening children and PLWs for acute malnutrition, treatment of SAM, Treatment of MAM), MIYCN program (provide nutrition counselling for caregivers and distribute MNPs/MNTs and other supplements commodities “LNS” for children and PLWs) in those facilities in the same areas mention in the table below

Also, AFAQ now provide MUAC screening for child 6-59 months and PLW through Health Community Based Surveillance activities in AL Moqawma camp in Azaz, Sarmad Camps, Termanin Camps.

AFAQ provide health activities (Screen, referral CU5 with dangers signs and Medical problems, Screen, referral PLWs with Medical problems and refer them to nearest health facilities for treatment, Educate and referral COVID-19 suspected cases, Educate project beneficiaries about vaccine Safety and Availability: Clarify the age groups who are eligible to receive the vaccine, according to updates from) through six nutrition rapid response teams RRTs.



## Health, Nutrition, and Protection integration

Deliver Primary healthcare services according Essential Health Service Package (EHSP) in five PHC fixed facilities, one mobile clinic, one maternal and child hospital and six RRTs.

Nurses screen children U5 and PLW for medical danger signs and visual signs of abuse /violence as well, coordination combined with referral will be in place if the team notices or identifies any sign of abuse or violence among children under 5 and or mothers.

All cases of violence against women and children will be referred to case management centres available in the area.

AFAQ provide recreation activities and IYCF corner for breast feeding and counselling in the health facilities.

Include child protection messages as part of nutrition and community outreach activities.

Combine nutrition and health programs with child protection such as child friendly spaces.

Ensure that those working in nutrition have signed up to and been trained in a code of conduct and are fully briefed on child protection concerns.

Make sure the most at-risk children are accessing services.



## Nutrition, and FSL integration

Training female on households' food processing through cooking sessions and focusing supplementary or feeding and nutrition programs for children should use foods rich in or fortified with vitamin A and Iron

Distributing tools-vouchers for safe food processing.

enable getting on main required kitchen equipment. Those assets can be used sustainably in future small projects by women.

Enable women to get main raw food materials for processing, also, follow up and mentoring the women to help them in putting a plan for small grant aims to encourage women of starting their small business projects.

Establishing mother to mother support groups in the first stages and building their capacity to be a nucleus in society and a basic pillar of participatory work among women. Also, handing them over the training items for future usage.

Distributing cash vouchers with value 60\$ (4 rounds), Through this activity only the Households which have children with SAM and have high vulnerability score will be targeted, and those data shall be collected from the RRTs on monthly bases.
